1. Introduction

2. What Are The Key Considerations When Assessing Your Current Bathroom For Renovation?

Consider how many times each day you enter the bathroom and use the amenities in this space. What time of day do you spend more time there, and what activities take place (aside from the obvious)? Do you retreat to a master bath to soak in a tub and read a magazine? Or, do you shower and run in a family bathroom, and share a vanity space with a spouse while you're getting ready for work?

Simply put: How do you use the bathroom?

Yes, this discussion can get rather personal, says Cameron Snyder, president, Roomscapes Luxury Design Center, Boston, Mass., and past-president of the National Kitchen & Bath Association (NKBA). "If the bathroom is a place where you quickly shower, brush your teeth and

go, the materials and colors will be different than if it is a place where you go to spend a couple hours with candles and soft music so you can unwind from the week."

"Bathrooms are a more personal space than kitchens," Snyder continues. "So some of the questions I ask clients may be personal, but I need to ask them because if you are designing this area for yourself and your family, you want to make sure it is personal."



For instance, how many people soak in the tub at one time? Do you shower alone? (If the answer is no, you may want multiple shower heads and more space in the shower.) Do you want a more private space for the toilet, and how is the ventilation working in that space now? How old are you? (This might be the most personal question of all!) Are you planning on staying in your current home and how will your needs change as you get older (known in the design industry as "aging in place")? Will your bathroom be able to accommodate these needs? The industry term universal design refers to the principle of designing features that cater to aging homeowners, such as attractive grab bars that double as towel racks and curbless showers.

The discovery you'll make during this process of determining how your bathroom must work for you is that despite the rudimentary appliances (toilet, shower, sink), this space functions very differently for everyone.

So while you're in the initial phases of determining what your existing space lacks, think big, says Lori Carroll, president, Lori Carroll & Associates, Tucson, Ariz. "Let's design your dream space," she tells her clients. "We can always value-engineer back, but let's start by creating the

vision. It may seem backward—the opposite of starting small—but at least you incorporate into the design all of the elements you want as opposed to adding them on later."

Then, Carroll says, you make choices based on what features you need and what you can afford. The extras can remain on your wish list as enhancements for down the road if you decide to do the project in phases. But start by addressing the essentials: space layout and appliances/fixtures.

Of course, what's essential depends on which bathroom you are remodeling. While your home has a single kitchen to focus all design efforts, you might have several bathrooms in the home and each one serves a different purpose. "The master bath is the second most important space in the house next to the kitchen," says Brian Johnson, principal, Collaborative Design Architects, Billings, Mt.. "This is where the magic happens when you get into design work—it's an intense, very specialty room."

On the other hand, the full bath is often a "family bathroom" for children and generally a space where function trumps fashion. "A three-year-old won't care about the vessel sink and granite countertops," Johnson says.

Three-quarter baths that include a toilet, sink and shower are generally utilitarian and here, too, a place where the budget might not allow for heated floors or shower sprays and intricate tilework. The powder room or half bath, on the other hand, is a tiny spot that can pack a serious design punch. As the saying goes about small packages?

"When you have guests over for a party, you want to give them a small sampling of what the home has to offer," Johnson says of why the powder room can make a big impression, especially when expressive materials are used for the basic sink-toilet-mirror setup: concrete countertops, glass vessel sink, natural stone tiles, cabinetry that looks like furniture.

So answering the question, "How do you use the bathroom?" depends on which bathroom is the focus of your remodeling project. Then, you must mentally walk through your day and decide how you want to use the space versus how the space works for you today.

3. How Can You Set A Realistic Budget for Your Bathroom Renovation?

Because bathrooms are one of the most used rooms in a home, they need regular maintenance and, sometimes, a full bathroom remodel. The National Kitchen and Bath Association (NKBA) suggests budgeting between 5% and 10% of your home's value for a bathroom remodel. If you have big bathroom remodel ideas and want to understand the cost to remodel a bathroom, learn more below.

On average, bathroom remodels cost about \$10,000. The most budget-friendly remodel can be done for \$2,500, while high-end projects can be upwards of \$30,000. You can expect to spend

between \$70 to \$250 per square foot to renovate your bathroom, depending on what type of upgrades you choose and the degree of luxury you want.



Bathroom Remodel Cost Breakdown

The size of the room, floor plan, number of fixtures and material quality all affect the final price of a bathroom remodel. Fixtures and flooring should make up about 15% of the total budget each, while painting is less at about 5%.

DIYers on a budget can spend as little as \$2,100 on materials for a bathroom remodel. Those willing to spend more on high-quality items should budget \$9,000. Prioritize your wants, then use estimated price points to pick and choose where to splurge or save.

Shower

The cost of a new shower can range from \$500 to \$5,000, which is a relatively wide range. It depends on which features you choose and which material the shower is made from. Showers with stone flooring and integrated seats are more costly at \$4,000 to \$5000. Small, acrylic showers are on the other end of the spectrum at about \$500.

Countertops

When choosing which type of countertops to install in your bathroom, consider your needs. Bathrooms are high-traffic areas, but they often don't need the same level of durability as kitchen countertops. Laminate countertops are a common choice for homeowners because of their low cost and easy installation.

Cabinets

Each manufacturer will have cabinets with different price tags, so shop around. Installing cabinets yourself isn't the best idea as it can be costly to fix mistakes down the road. Consider hiring a contractor to help you get the job done. Installation costs can be between \$1,200 and \$13,000.

Toilet

Both the material cost and installing a toilet are low compared to other costs involved in a remodel. Basic toilets that will get the job done go for about \$80, while high-end, sleek models can cost up to \$8,000.

Vanity

Vanities typically include a bathroom counter, cabinets and a sink and faucet, and cost between \$300 and \$3,800. For custom vanities, the price can be even higher, exceeding \$10,000.

Flooring

The cost of redoing your bathroom floor will depend on which material you choose. Linoleum is the most budget-friendly flooring option, costing just \$45 for an average bathroom. Wood flooring can be significantly higher, at least \$200. Consider what look you're going for when deciding which to install in your updated bathroom.

Paint

Experts say paint gives you the most bang for your buck. It's one of the least expensive parts of a remodel, but it can make the biggest difference in the way the room looks. Painting your bathroom will cost between \$350 to \$750 and it's a fun DIY project.

Plumbing

Unlike painting, water and pipes should be left to plumbing professionals. Expect to spend up to \$1,450 in materials and up to \$16,000 in labor. Plumbing is expensive, but having it done correctly is worth it.

Bathroom Remodel Labor Costs

Savvy homeowners may decide to install some of these elements themselves, but some projects, like plumbing, should be left to a professional. Calling in a contractor to help you complete these projects will cost thousands of dollars. Installation costs vary widely, but in general, the higher end your fixture or material is, the more contractors will charge to install it.

Master Bathroom Remodel Costs

According to the NKBA, homeowners invest the most in their master bathrooms, also known as en suite bathrooms—an average of \$32,000. That cost will depend on which materials you use.

Luxury items, like jetted tubs, will be more costly than standard ones. Master baths often include a separate shower and bathtub, double vanity and more space for things like cabinets and fixtures.

Small Bathroom Remodel Costs

The cost to remodel a master bathroom is nearly twice that of remodeling small bathrooms, like a main or guest bath. The NKBA estimates that homeowners spend, on average, \$18,000 to remodel a guest bath and \$12,000 for a powder room that does not include a bathtub or shower.

Factors That Affect the Cost of a Bathroom Remodel

The cost of a bathroom remodel can vary due to many factors, such as the size of the bathroom, the quality of materials you use, the style you choose and the contractor's hourly rate. Therefore, before you begin budgeting for your bathroom remodel, you should know the costs involved for the types of renovations you want.



Material Costs

A bathroom remodel can be stressful, especially when you don't know how much it will cost to complete. Considering the variety of materials available and the wild diversity of their pricing makes, it is difficult to predict what a reasonable budget looks like.

You can get some idea by considering just the type of materials that will go into your bathroom renovation. Materials include everything from tile and flooring to shower doors and hardware. It's important to begin planning your renovation by learning about different types of materials so that you can make educated decisions about what will work best for your space.

Contractor and Labor Costs

Although they are only sometimes included in your total bid, contractor and labor costs are essential factors to consider for your bathroom remodel project. Labor typically comes to 40% to 65% of your total remodeling budget or \$50 to \$75 per hour. However, labor will vary depending on the scope and complexity of your project. Your total labor cost also can depend on where you live. For instance, expect to pay more in urban areas with higher living expenses.

Type of Bathroom

Bathroom remodels are one of the most popular home renovations. But there are different types of remodels, like half-bath or powder room remodels, full-bathroom remodels or primary bathroom remodels. The type of bathroom you want will dictate whether to choose one or the other and how much it will cost you in the long run.

- Half-bath or powder room remodels cost \$2,000 to \$5,000 on average.
- Full bath remodels cost \$6,000 to \$15,000 on average.
- Primary bath remodels cost \$10,000 to \$30,000 on average.

Size of Bathroom

It's no secret that bathroom remodels cost more the larger the bathroom. If your bathroom needs to be gutted and rebuilt from top to bottom, this will definitely be reflected in your construction costs. But if all you need is a few repairs or upgrades, it's possible to keep costs down by focusing on efficiency and style when planning your new space.

Style and Finish

The style and finish you choose for your project can significantly impact the cost of building or remodeling your bathroom. Bathroom remodeling projects come with many design choices. You must decide which finishes and materials to use, from flooring to cabinets, tile, tubs and showers.

However, it's essential to remember that luxury style and finishes like top-of-the-line fixtures and tile will not only add to the aesthetic, but will also increase the cost.


Clever bathroom layout ideas are a must in family bathrooms.

'When space is tight in a home then the family bathroom often loses out size-wise, which means careful planning is more important than ever,' says Deborah Bass, founder of Base Interior.

'A small but well-planned bathroom can be more inviting and comfortable than a badly designed larger bathroom. The key is to focus on ease of movement and ergonomics, so that everything can be accessed without feeling cramped or compromised.

'For example, bath faucets that the kids won't bump their heads on, basin taps that are easy to reach and operate, towel radiators that you can actually hang a towel on, and of course ample and accessible storage.'

Making each item earn its place is vital; a bath with an overhead shower performs two roles in one footprint, while a toilet seat can act as a handy perching point for monitoring bath time.



2. Invest In A Show-Stopping Bath

7. What Are Some DIY Solutions for Cleaning Glass Shower Doors and Maintaining their Shine?

It is true that glass doors and walls are quite stylish and practical, but they also collect dirt frequently. Every time you shower, these surfaces gather shower products, water droplets, and body soil. The soap scum generated by the minerals in the water, soap, and body soil might permanently etch the glass, creating a foggy mess. Thus, it is essential to understand the right methods for cleaning glass shower doors if you want your bathroom to retain its shine. The good news is that there are plenty of methods you can utilise to deal with the dirt and buildup. For people nearing the end of their tenancy, hiring budget bond cleaners in Adelaide is an ideal choice. For other times, here is how to clean glass shower doors for a perfect shine. Follow these tips to ensure a clean glass shower door.



1. How Often Should You Clean The Shower Doors?

The glass shower doors must be cleaned after every use. It is the ideal way to maintain their cleanliness. The process is quite simple. Just a quick spray with an appropriate cleaning solution followed by the use of a squeegee to remove it will do the job. It will reduce the chances of soap scum accumulation. Another way to do this is by skipping the usage of cleaners altogether and simply wiping the surface to eliminate water and buildup. If daily cleaning is not a possibility, then at least deep clean the glass shower doors on a weekly basis to maintain hygiene.

2. Use Vinegar To Clean The Surface

Vinegar is one of the most used ingredients for DIY cleaning. So, it is best to use it for cleaning the glass shower doors. Here are the steps you should follow to ensure a thorough cleaning:

Prepare The Cleaning Solution

To prepare an effective vinegar solution, just combine two parts of distilled water and two parts of distilled white vinegar. Mix and add them in a spray bottle. Next, add about ¹/₄ teaspoon of dishwashing liquid. It will help the cleaner stick to the glass. This solution is often used for best bond cleaning Adelaide.

Spray The Solution

Generously spray the solution on the glass. Remember to start from the top before working your way downwards. Let the cleaner sit there for at least 5 minutes so that it can deal with the soap scum. However, if you use this solution right after every shower when the glass is wet, you can skip the waiting phase.

Wipe The Surface

Utilise a gentle squeegee or sponge to wipe down the glass surface. Again, start from the top before working your way down.

Rinse And Dry

If you utilised a sponge for cleaning, rinse the glass doors using clean water. To dry it properly, use a lint-free microfibre towel. If you cleaned the surface with a squeegee, make use of the towel to eliminate the smears or smudges.

3. Clean The Door With Lemon Juice

Another effective way to ensure the glass shower doors are clean is to use a lemon juice cleaning solution. It is not as strong as vinegar and can be used for daily cleaning purposes. Here is the process you should follow:

Prepare The Cleaning Solution

Combine equal parts of distilled water and lemon juice. Add ¹/₄ teaspoon of dishwashing liquid. Mix all the ingredients by adding them in a spray bottle.

Spray The Cleaner

Spray the DIY solution onto the surface. Start from the top before working your way down. Let it sit there for around 5 minutes before proceeding further.

Wipe The Glass

Starting from the top, make use of a sponge or squeegee to wipe the glass surface. Work your way down to ensure there are no visible signs of streaks and smudges.

Rinse And Dry

Rinse away the remnants of the cleaning solution by using clean water. If you are using a squeegee, then rinsing might not be necessary. Utilise a microfibre towel to ensure the glass is dry and free of any streaks.

4. Clean The Shower Door Tracks Appropriately

It is common for shower door tracks to capture all the dirt and soap scum. So, it is essential to clean them during bond cleaning in Adelaide to get the deposit back. It must be done each time you deep clean the glass shower doors. Here is the process to follow:

Ensure The Drainage Hole Is Plugged In

Find the drainage hole in the shower door track. Then, plug it in with a paper towel or an old washcloth.

Use Vinegar To Fill The Door Track



Fill the track by pouring undiluted distilled white vinegar. It is recommended to let it sit there for a minimum of four hours or, ideally, overnight.

Scrub The Door Track

After the vinegar has broken down the soap scum, unplug the drain holes to facilitate the draining of the vinegar. Utilise an old toothbrush to scrub the door track and remove any dirt or soap scum.

Rinse And Dry

Use distilled water to rinse the shower door track. Repeat the previous steps if needed. Finally, dry with a microfibre towel. You will have a clean bathroom.
